

WOODLAND STEWARDS

A Regional Extension Program for Landowners

The Woodland Stewards regional landowner education program was collaboratively developed by eight different Extension organizations and completed its third year of programming in February 2021. The goal of the program was to empower woodland owners to promote environmental and forest health through increased awareness, experience and access to resources. The 2019-2020 series were broadcast via webinar software to in-person landowner groups hosted by county and regional agents. In contrast, the 2021 series included all virtual participants who were able to join the event themselves. More than 1500 people, from all 50 states and other countries, joined the four weekly webinars, more than half of which were from the South! Participants rated the program highly and the majority indicated that they would recommend it to others.
